2	<p>National Update</p> <p>Childhood Obesity Strategy (COS) – Primary</p> <p>Outlined in this strategy is a sugar tax levy. To give more resources to schools to promote healthy active lifestyles. Funding of the PE premium is most likely to be doubled, or at least the core funding could be approximately £16k for primary schools; however this funding is only confirmed till 2020. Schools will have to demonstrate the sustainability and impact of how they are spending their funding. The COS also states there will be voluntary healthy schools rating that will be taken into account during OFSTED. Parents will be actively involved in this rating. Schools will also have to identify a governor who will be the champion of PE and Healthy Active Lifestyles. Further information is expected in the summer term. Headlines of the COS and what it means for schools can be found on our home page – www.peschoolsportcsw.org.uk or the Government’s update can be found here - https://engage.dh.gov.uk/childhoodobesity/</p> <p>Schools to have on their website as a condition of the Primary PE and School Sport funding, details of how they have spent their PE funding by the 4th April. This should include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the amount of premium received • a full breakdown of how it has been spent (or will be spent) • what impact the school has seen on pupils’ PE and sport participation and attainment • how the improvements will be sustainable in the future. <p>Secondary</p> <p>Approximately £300mil from the sugar tax levy accessible to 25% of secondary schools to facilitate a longer school day to provide extra support for healthy active lifestyles. Targeted for areas of deprivation and there will be an application process. Sport England confirmed they will be working with existing pathways to train two secondary school teachers in every school by 2020. Training is due to start September 2017. Further details are expected in the summer.</p> <p>School Games Review</p> <p>Currently School Games Organisers and other key partners are being consulted on what the KPIs will look like for the 2017 – 2018 academic year. Most likely link to the health agenda and participation, not just sport activities. Outcomes should be published by Easter. The tender for School Games Levels 1,2 and 4 is currently out nationally.</p> <p>Premier League 4 Sport</p> <p>Premier League are investing in clubs to work with primary schools. Investment is for coaches to deliver in primary schools, clubs in our area are Aston Villa,</p>	<p>Primary Schools to have details of their Primary PE Premium on their school website by 4th April</p>

	<p>Birmingham City, West Brom and Coventry City. Some schools have already been approached. All schools should be offered an opportunity by 2020. Some concern that coaches have offered to teach subjects other than PE, for example, numeracy and literacy. School should fully understand what the coaches are offering and any hidden costs, as well as checking for quality, qualifications and experience.</p>	
<p>3</p>	<p>Local Update</p> <p>Primary PE Subject Leaders Day Conference evaluation attached. On the whole very positive feedback. Key thing for next year is the venue, San Souci in Solihull and Alan Higgs were suggested.</p> <p>Primary Premium Awards Nationally the County Sports Partnership Network (CSW Sport is 1 of 44 County Sports Partnerships) is organising awards to reward and recognise primary schools that are effectively and innovatively spending their Primary premium. CSW will hold their own nominations, the winners of CSW will go through to a West Midlands awards, and these winners will then go through to the national award. The COS also states there will be national awards, so there are discussions at the moment to see if the two can be combined.</p> <p>Family Fund - £40mil Sport England will be releasing information about a £40 mil Family Fund, aimed at increasing physical activity and sport within families. This could be significant for schools, as partners may want to work with schools and use schools facilities as hubs for their projects. Further information will be available in March.</p> <p>Healthy Schools Pilot CSW Sport are working with SCCU and 4 schools -2 in Coventry, 1 in Rugby and 1 in Solihull. Basic child friendly fitness tests will be carried out on certain year groups. The schools then chose a variety of CPD for the staff either for curriculum or extra curriculum time. At the end of the school year the pupils will be tested again to see if there have been any improvements. <p>4</p>	<p>The future purpose of the group – review of the TOR</p> <p>At the previous meeting it was agreed that the group would re-look at the Terms of Reference and the way the group was working.</p> <p>The reach of the group was discussed, members shared the information they receive at the meetings, but this was in a variety of ways: at head teacher meetings, with senior leadership and with other staff members. It was felt however that due to the make-up of the group the CSW area was not being covered effectively. The group recognised it had brought about change, for instance JT informed us that the Coventry School Games Organisers are working</p>	

	<p>closer with PE coordinators to ensure there is increased participation in events. There was a suggestion that there could be individual area meetings, in Coventry, Solihull, N Warwickshire and S. Warwickshire, however this also had its difficulties. The group also thought it was beneficial to learn from other areas. It was agreed that the following would be a way forward:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Termly newsletters from CSW Sport with all the national and local updates themed on the following headings: Physical Education, School Sport, Healthy Active Lifestyles and Skills for Life. • There would be an annual meeting held in September with all updates and requirements for that year. • CSW Sport and YST would attend local head teacher meetings to brief more head teachers making them aware of national updates and the requirements for their school.
